

The Selectmen Meeting Minutes  
Monday, September 28, 2015

Present: Chairman Darcy; Selectmen Diorio; Gallagher; Rideout and TA Collins. Selectmen Nebelski excused.

6:00 p.m. Chairman Darcy called the meeting to order.

Selectman Diorio made a motion to approve the manifest of September 28, 2015, second by Gallagher. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Rideout made a motion to approve the public & non-public minutes of September 21st, second by Gallagher. Motion passes unanimously.

TA Collins read a letter to Felicity Freese regarding the denial of accepting her generous offer to donate a plaque for the Police Station. Selectman Rideout made a motion to approve the letter with corrections, second by Gallagher. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Diorio made a motion to approve the letter to Cornelius McCarthy to deny the water abatement request, second by Rideout. The vote is as follows: Gallagher – I; Diorio – I; Rideout – abstained. Motion passes.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve the GIS Internet Service Maintenance Agreement with CAI Technologies in the amount of \$1,800, second by Diorio. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Rideout made a motion to approve an open container permit for Janice Sevene for October 3, 2015 at the Community Center, second by Diorio. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve the sewer and water connections for Jason Gardner at 40 Canal Street, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

The Selectmen reviewed a letter submitted by Terry Johnson regarding a neighbor's fire pit. The situation has been reviewed by the Fire Chief. A permit was obtained. TA Collins will mail a response letter to Mr. Johnson.

There will be a public hearing on the Hinsdale's Hazard Mitigation Plan on October 19<sup>th</sup>.

An extension for the Oak Hill Acres Infrastructure Project will be submitted to CDFR. The Extension is for December 31, 2016.

Selectman Diorio:

- He attended the Park & Rec meeting: 112 students signed up for K – 6 soccer, the committee reviewed the budgets, comments were made regarding the flooding of the field building, and Karen Johnson needs to replace a door hand at the community center;
- Kathryn Lynch and Lynn McLoughlin are working on a semi-annual newsletter that we be placed around town for the public to review in October.

Selectmen Gallagher:

- He will be working with Chief Faulkner and Michael Bomba with installing lockers at the at the new Police Station.

Selectman Darcy:

- The delinquencies due for property taxes has decreased;
- Discussion took place regarding vehicles registered in Vermont at properties throughout town.

Cindy Mason and Jeana Woodbury from the Hinsdale Post Office joined the board to discuss the 200 Birthday of the Hinsdale Post Office which will be taking place August 5, 2016. The post office is forming a committee for some special events, and would like a member of the Board of Selectmen to serve on the committee. Bernie Rideout would like to serve on the committee.

Next Week the Selectmen will be a workshop on employee reviews and deeding properties.
