

Selectmen's Meeting Minutes  
Monday, May 16, 2016

Present: Chairman Gallagher (at 6:55 p.m.), Selectmen Darcy, Diorio, McCosker, Rideout; and T.A. Collins.

6:00 Selectman Diorio called the meeting to order and yielded the floor to Town Attorney John Ratigan.

Attorney Ratigan updated committee members and attendees with discussion including Selectman Use of Its Meeting Agenda as a tool to communicate with the public and scheduling; Right to Know Law covering consultation with legal counsel and communications outside of meeting, meeting minutes, and town records.

6:44 Selectmen reconvened at Town Hall.

Selectman McCosker made a motion to approve the manifest s of 5/16/16 and the public minutes of 5/9/16, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Darcy made a motion to approve the non-public minutes of 5/9/16, second by McCosker. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Darcy made a motion to approve the abatement for Sean Leary in the amount of \$9.18, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Darcy made a motion to approve the Yield Tax assessed for Alex Rideout, in the amount of 0, second by McCosker, Selectman Rideout abstained. Motion passes.

Selectman Darcy made a motion to approve the Yield Tax assessed for Richard & Donna Hood in the amount of 0, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Darcy made a motion to approve the bills for the Forest Fire Report (fire on Chesterfield Road), second by McCosker. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Rideout made a motion to approve the Deputy Warden Appointment forms for Jason Santos, Steven Gassett, and Terry Zavorotny, second by Darcy. Motion passes unanimously.

Board was informed that Phantom Fireworks is receiving a notice sent today re: storage containers being moved in early and a fine imposed for \$550.00.

Board was informed that the fine payment check from Savinelli (Fantasy Fireworks) was sent back due to lack of completion.

T.A. Collins informed the Board that she has spoken with Shannon O'Connor and her intent to speak with her attorney to redeem property.

Board was informed that Justin Pasay from Town Attorney's office will be scheduled to come in to talk about manufactured housing parks: steps to be taken, timing, and concerns re deeding process.

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James O'Malley from the School Board informed the board that school will be ending in a few weeks, the Elementary School will be meeting on solution re: student population, update on initiative for pooling with a hydro producer for savings on power, and that there will be no increase in school lunch prices for the next school year. He also mentioned State House Bill re: Disposition of Municipal Records and that if pursued could save storage space and costs.

Sean Leary spoke to the Board about proposed Farmer's Market Hours on July 10<sup>th</sup>.

Selectman Rideout made a motion to allow the Farmer's Market to run until 3 on July 10<sup>th</sup>, second by Darcy. Motion passes unanimously.

James MacDonell mentioned to the Board that there have been allegations of speeding and a couple of dogs have been hit recently in town.

Selectman Rideout updated the Board that he met with committee members Thursday re: the Post Office celebration. Lindsay Blake from the PTA will be looking into ideas to get the kids involved and researching re: possibility of telephone pole signs. He also mentioned that Rick Krane intends to fix steps and ramp at the meetinghouse in late June or July. Board discussed possibility that if this is done, he can use the building at no cost.

Selectman Darcy made a motion that Rick Krane can use the building at no cost if he repairs the steps and ramp, second by Diorio. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Diorio attended recent School Board Meeting. Standard Power of America was discussed having no downside.

Selectman McCosker mentioned town employees recently working at boat ramp and that Mr. Ebbighausen was appreciative.

Selectman Darcy noted that the Farmer's Market starts this Sunday from 10 to 1 and wondered if the Town had any issues with putting up signs at Route 63 intersections. Discussion followed.

Selectman Rideout made a motion to allow putting up signs at Route 63 intersections, second by McCosker. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Darcy would like the Board to consider information to be put on the website. Board discussion followed and goal to keep discussing and take action soon.

Selectman Darcy attended Zoning Board Meeting last week and mentioned upcoming Planning Board Meeting
