

The Selectmen Meeting Minutes
Monday, May 18, 2015

Present: Chairman Darcy; Selectmen Diorio; Gallagher; Nebelski; Rideout and TA Collins.

6:00 p.m. Chairman Darcy called the meeting to order.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve the public and non-public minutes of May 11, 2015, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve the manifest of May 18, 2015, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Nebelski made a motion to approve the appointment papers for Peter Zavorotny as Deputy Treasurer, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to sign the letter to William Lambert in support of installing Scenic Bicycle Byway Signs in Hinsdale, second by Nebelski. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Nebelski made a motion to approve the Forest Fire Report/Bill for the State of NH in the amount of \$3,556.00, second by Diorio. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Nebelski made a motion to approve the Water Abatements for Wal-Mart in the amount of \$1,282.42; \$26,912.03; and \$3,835.41 for the first quarter of 2015, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve various tax abatements in the amount of \$1,188.27 due to clerical errors, second by Nebelski. Motion passes unanimously.

Members of SHOC were present to discuss their committee meeting for use of the Meetinghouse. They are working on the following items: A Movie Night in July; Ground Rules for use of the Teen Center; Getting Chaperones for Friday/Saturday nights from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.; and they are in need of a new advisor.

Water Supt. Dennis Nadeau was present to discuss summer water usage. He is suggesting the placement a meter on the outside faucet in order to read garden and pool usage. There will be a charge of \$25.00 to install and an agreement that will need to be signed by the property owner. Selectman Rideout made a motion to approve, second by Nebelski. Motion passes unanimously. Supt. Nadeau will work on the agreement and forward it to TA Collins for approval.

Selectman Diorio discussed the School Board Meeting. Nine students were acknowledged as NH Scholars; Mike Darcy will participate in the search for a Superintendent; there are 15 National Honor inductees; the school is interested in the Solar Project; the PTA Color-thon raised \$7,500; and Graduation is June 13th at 11:00 a.m.

Selectman Darcy requested additional trash cans for the Farmer's Market. The Farmer's Market had a successful start with 15 vendors.

Selectman Nebelski is continuing to gather information for lighting the flag poles; the flashing lights at the school are still not on the right time; and the lights in the park need to be checked for on and off accuracy.

James O'Malley provided information to soccer field grants; the school is interested in solar panels; and the Water Source Protection Plan should be finalized.

Chairman Darcy swore in Officer Louis Yelle.

Chief Faulkner gave the board an update on the Police Station construction. As long as a policy is in place that is approved by the fire chief, there will not be a need to sprinkle the detention room. In order to save costs – carpeting, vinyl and sealing will be used instead of polished concrete.

Discussion regarding Holiday pay leave took place. This will be revisited when the PD is at full staff.

The animal control officer has been very busy and is working approximately 25 hours per week.

Changes for the Traffic Ordinance were discussed. Parking on School Street was discussed and the need for better signage.

The Towing Services Memorandum of Understanding was passed out. Chief Faulkner will email a copy to TA Collins so she can forward to the Town Attorney for review.

The Traffic Ordinance and Smoking Policy will be scheduled for a public hearing.

7:15 p.m. Selectman Rideout made a motion to enter into a non-public session under RSA 91:A-3, II, c. reputation, second by Gallagher. The vote is as follows: Darcy – I; Diorio – I; Gallagher – I; Nebelski – I; Rideout – I. Motion passes unanimously

7:40 p.m. Regular meeting reconvened.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to seal the minutes, second by Diorio. The vote is as follows: Darcy – I; Diorio – I; Gallagher – I; Nebelski – I; Rideout – I. Motion passes unanimously.
