

The Selectmen Meeting Minutes  
Monday, July 6, 2015

Present: Chairman Darcy; Selectmen Diorio; Gallagher; Nebelski; Rideout and TA Collins.

6:00 p.m. Chairman Darcy called the meeting to order.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve the public and non-public minutes of June 15<sup>th</sup> & June 29<sup>th</sup>, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to approve manifest of July 6<sup>th</sup>, second by Rideout. Motion passes unanimously

6:05 p.m. Selectman Gallagher made a motion to enter into a non-public session under RSA 91:A-3, II,c - reputation. second by Rideout. The vote is as follows: Darcy – I; Diorio – I; Gallagher – I; Nebelski – I; Rideout – I. Motion passes unanimously.

6:55 p.m. Regular meeting reconvened.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to seal the minutes, second by Rideout. The vote is as follows: Darcy – I; Diorio – I; Gallagher – I; Nebelski – I; Rideout – I. Motion passes unanimously.

6:56 p.m. The Chairman adjourned the meeting in order to tour the Police Station. The tour was not open to the public for safety reasons. Discussion will take place following the tour when the meeting is reconvened.

Selectman Gallagher made a motion to have the Chairman sign the engagement letter for Roberts & Green, PLLC

7:45 p.m. Meeting reconvened.

TA Collins read the areas toured at the Police Station: Sallie Port; Booking Room; Equipment Room; Evidence Room and pass through locker; Computer Lab; Mechanical Room; Location of Generator; Data Room; Training Room – will have a kitchenette donated by Home Depot and a 60” Screen Television donated by Walmart; Dispatch and Records; Call box will be located outside front door; Bathroom; various officer’s offices; Interview and Juvenile Detention; Supervisor Room; Kitchen – cabinets and refrigerator donated by Home Depot; Locker room with male and female showers; Officers area.

The bail commissioner’s station will be located outside the booking room with a pass through window.

All systems will be tested prior to putting in the ceiling.

Chief Faulkner would like to hold a volunteer weekend for moving into the PD and will have a BBQ after to thank the volunteers.

There will be an open house.

Selectman Diorio made a motion to encumber \$23,000 from the 2014-2015 budgets to update the windows in the new PD, second by Nebelski. Motion passes unanimously. TA Collins is to check with the auditor to make sure this can be done. If we are not going to get a credit for the existing windows, the windows can be saved for another project.

The Selectmen would like to have Chief Faulkner back to discuss the Traffic Ordinance – there is a concern regarding no parking on several streets. The Selectmen would like to look into time limits.

The Tax Collector requested a reasonable amount not to lien from the Selectmen. Selectman Rideout made a motion to view the list of potential liens, second by Nebelski. Motion passes unanimously. The Selectmen reviewed the list.

Selectman Rideout motioned to waive placing a lien on properties owing \$100 or less, second by Diorio. Motion passes unanimously.

Selectman Rideout stated there is a Parks & Recreation Committee meeting on Thursday.

Selectman Nebelski would like to get a quote to have a structural engineer look at the clock tower.

Selectman Nebelski made mentioned that currently the town has only two people with a Class A CDL. TA Collins said Hwy Supt. Podlenski is working on having another employee go for the CDL A.

Selectman Nebelski will make sure the sub-committee for the clock tower posts their meetings.

The Historical Society is looking to borrow a mower or to have someone mow the fields 2 times a year.

Selectman Gallagher stated the Conservation Commission met, but did not have a quorum.
